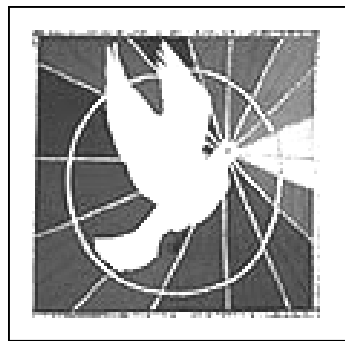

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Explain to your child the difference between pranks and vandalism. Throwing eggs may seem like fun but clean up and damages caused can ruin a fun Halloween.

Go trick or treating with your kids and keep them safe low traffic areas with plenty of well lighted streets.

TIPS FOR KIDS

Be careful when carving your pumpkins using only safety carvers and not sharp knives.
