# Boy Scouts of America—the Leaders who helped make it happen

In your Scout folders you received in early September at registration, there is an article about **Baden-Powell** you should review. Last month we learned about William D. Boyce, the man who officially founded the BSA on February 8th, 1910 in Washington, D.C. He had lots of help getting it off the ground including other men who had similar, smaller-scale, outdoor-based organizations for boys.

One of them was **Daniel Carter Beard**, who is immortalized in this painting to the right by the great American artist, **Norman Rockwell**, who painted many Scouting classic images for *Boys Life* magazine. If you would

like to see a full-size and color version of this painting, it is hanging on a wall in the Childrens Museum of Indianapolis. It is in a very public area and you have probably passed it on previous visits to the museum without even noticing.

You should go exploring and see if you can find this painting the next time you go for a visit to the Childrens Museum. And be sure to look at it carefully. You have the opportunity to get to know who is featured in the painting by reading the brief article that immediately follows. Study it because near the end of this school year there will be a contest among our Cub Scouts regarding these historic Scouting figures.



## Daniel Carter Beard (1850-1941)

**Daniel Carter Beard** grew up hearing stories of pioneer days and exploring the woods near his Covington, Kentucky home. After attending art school in New York City, he began a long career as a writer and illustrator.

One winter day in New York, Beard came across some newsboys sleeping on the damp pavement of Printing House Square. It was this sight that "**started me on my lifelong crusade for American Boyhood,**" he later wrote.

In 1905, in the pages of *Recreation* magazine, Beard created a loosely organized boys' program he called the **Sons of Daniel Boone**. Somewhere between 2,000 and 20,000 boys joined the group in the next few years, organizing



themselves in "forts" and "stockades" and taking on the names of heroes such as Daniel Boone (president), Kit Carson (treasurer), and Davy Crockett (secretary). When Beard joined

*Pictorial Review* magazine, he renamed the group **Boy Pioneers of America** and published its first handbook.

With the advent of the Boy Scouts of America, Beard shut down his nascent organization and joined the Boy Scouts of America as one of the first national commissioners.

"**Uncle Dan,**" as he was known, remained involved in Scouting until his death in 1941—even showing up at the 1937 National Scout Jamboree to light the opening campfire with flint and steel. He was honored with one of the first Silver Buffalo Awards in 1926.
