HOW AMERICANS PRACTICE CITIZENSHIP

Citizens of the U.S. can and should participate in their government. This process ensures that the power always remains where it belongs—with the people.

The most important right citizens have is the right to vote. By voting, people have a voice in their government. The people decide who will represent them in the national, state and local levels. Before voting in an election, each citizen should be well

informed about the issues and candidates.

The government may call upon citizens to serve on a jury. This is called Jury Duty. The members of a jury decide a court case as fairly as they can based upon the evidence presented by both sides as fairly as they can.

Every person is expected to obey the laws of the community, state and country in which he or she lives. All Americans are expected to

respect the rights of others. All persons living in the U.S. are expected to pay taxes honestly and on time.
